



The first declared and self-proclaimed great crisis of globalization in the 21st century has brought out a latent and long removed European crisis. The main institutions of the old continent – national States and the European Union – are no more able to govern, to contain and to rule the increasing economic, territorial, social and cultural differences between its different areas.

The lack of interpretations of the crisis and, consequently, the lack of the responses to address the problems made even more clear the economic difficulties, accentuate the deficit of consensus on the European project and further undermine the European international image. In order to achieve a better reading of the crisis, it is necessary to focus on its recent and remote causes, as well as its constitutional, legal, cultural and social implications.

The seminar organized by ISSiRFA and the *EuropePolis* Network is dedicated to study in depth of these critical challenges. The first objective of the lectures and the contributions, that will be presented and discussed during the working sessions of the seminar, is to promote a Permanent Observatory on the new dynamics characterizing the process of supranational integration in the globalized world. Furthermore there should be developed a laboratory of ideas, proposals and projects on the reorganization of the European public space, on the measurement of the philosophical and cultural tensions, affecting European traditions (Christianity, Enlightenment, etc.) and European relations with large areas outside Europe (in particular the Mediterranean area, the Eastern area and Latin America).

The aspect of the feasibility of the above described 'general project' will be specifically the core of the third session of the seminar dedicated to the establishment of the *EuropePolis* Network.
